

S.D. STATE AGRICULTURAL HERITAGE MUSEUM

The S.D. State Agricultural Heritage Museum is dedicated to the preservation and interpretation of objects that relate to South Dakota agricultural history and rural heritage from 1860 to 1960. The museum tells the story of South Dakota's vast and varied agricultural past and the determination it took to survive on the land. The Farm Power gallery features animal, human, steam, wind, and internal combustion power. The South Dakota Made gallery features products, patents, and dreams made in South Dakota prior to 1930. It features the only three remaining tractors made in South Dakota. The Life on the Land gallery features an original Dakota Territory claim shanty contrasted with a 1915 farm wife's dream house. The museum is open year round.

HORSE BARN ARTS CENTER

Built in the late 1800's, owned by the City of Sioux Falls and currently managed by the Sioux Empire Arts Council, the Horse Barn Arts Center houses the Loft Gallery in the former hayloft, and the Portfolio Gallery in the main level. Both galleries feature rotating exhibits of local art, and there is a gift shop in one of the former horse stalls. A variety of activities take place in both levels, from artist demonstrations to hands-on activities for kids and adults, classes and workshops, poetry readings, artist receptions, and musical performances. Open year round, hours vary.

SCULPTUREWALK

SculptureWalk is an exciting exhibit of 45 original sculptures displayed all year long, from the Pavilion to the Falls, in downtown Sioux Falls. The sculptures are owned by the artists and loaned to the exhibit for one year. In June of each year the sculptures are changed for the next year. During the summer the public votes for their favorite sculpture, the People's Choice Award, and that sculpture is purchased by the city. A Best of Show Award is also presented. All sculptures are for sale to the public. Brochures are available downtown in outdoor boxes and from merchants. See how early peoples hunted, gathered, and farmed in the region for over 10,000 years. View an outstanding collection of Dakota and Lakota artifacts and a diorama of a Lakota Family Camp. See historic photographs, plants, animals, rocks and minerals of the South Dakota prairie. In the Lewis & Clark Center is an 8'x20' mural depicting their walk up Spirit Mound and a touch screen computer system which allows visitors to learn more about Lewis & Clark's visit to this area, and an artifacts case displays two original journals, a rifle from 1803 and more.
